


Table 1: LMA FY14 Priorities

1. **Lead Poisoning Prevention Strategy:** Develop a comprehensive Lead Poisoning Prevention strategy and draft legislation that considers: implementation of the federal Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) rule; blood lead surveillance testing requirements; case management of 5-10 µg/dl blood lead levels; requirements for 1950 to pre-1978 housing units; lead poisoning prevention in owner-occupied homes; and funding options for loans and grants to make housing repairs to mitigate lead poisoning in pre-78 homes. (LPPP)
2. **Zero Waste Action Plan:** Develop a comprehensive strategy to minimize the need for waste disposal facilities by 2030. Currently, the waste diversion goal is 85 percent and the recycling goal is 80 percent by 2030. The zero waste strategy may include: increased composting (especially food wastes); increased recycling of beverage containers and other packaging; implementation of pay-as-you-throw measures; expanded focus on recycling in the commercial sector; mandatory recycling and disposal bans for certain materials; expanded State agency recycling; and extended producer responsibility for a product's life cycle. The overall goals are to save energy and natural resources, preserve landfill capacity, and reduce greenhouse gases and other pollutants generated by landfills and manufacturing processes. (WDUP)
3. **Redevelopment of Brownfield Sites:** Continue to ensure that Brownfield sites are properly investigated and appropriately remediated in a manner that is protective of public health and the environment, while allowing for productive reuse. Two current top priority sites are the former Bethlehem Steel/Sparrows Point site and the former Allied Signal site in Baltimore City. (LRP)
